Blue-GIFT Access: 3rd Call for Applications

The main objective of Blue-GIFT (Blue Growth and Innovation Fast Tracked) is to help Atlantic Area¹ (AA) enterprises test marine renewable energy technology in real sea environments and to enable power to be economically generated from the ocean.

For this purpose, the project consortium, is happy to announce the **3rd Call for Applications** for access to testing in four test sites in the AA region specifically Portugal, Northern Spain, Western France and Canary Islands (see Test Site Table below). The access will allow developers to perform low cost tests and validation of marine renewable energy technologies in real sea environments. The applications received will be checked for eligibility, evaluated by a User Selection Board² and, if successful, the applicants will be recommended for a Support Package Voucher². The Voucher will facilitate low cost access to the test site under the terms of the access contract to be negotiated with the test site providing access.

The types of technologies this call is aimed at includes, floating offshore wind, wave energy, tidal energy and floating solar.

Who can apply?

1. Any enterprise can apply, in whatever form or purpose, whether research centre, third level education institution, company or individual. The applicant must own the technology (or rights to the technology) being tested or validated, and must be **ready to start testing their technology prior to the project end date in August 2022**;
2. Preference will be given to technologies available for testing in 2021; please see the Rules and Conditions for a complete definition of eligibility;

¹ Interreg Atlantic Area covers the western part of Europe bordering the Atlantic Ocean. It comprises 36 regions from the western part UK, Ireland, Portugal, the northern and south westernmost part of Spain, western France and Canary Islands (Spain), the Autonomous Regions of the Azores and Madeira (Portugal). Enterprises from outside these countries may need to establish a subsidiary or a branch.

How to apply?

1. Applicants should first contact the Access Coordinator for general information on the call and for eventual guidance in selecting a test site (see *Contacts* below);
2. Applicants are then asked to familiarise themselves with the test site they want to access (listed as first choice in the Application Form), by contacting the test site and holding a preliminary discussion on their test plan and objectives. Additional contacts with test sites listed as second or third choices are also recommended.
3. Applicants should read the Application Form and fully understand the information that is being requested. Once all the recommended preparatory steps have been taken and the required information is at hand, applicants should fill out the Application Form by editing the Word document.
4. The completed Application Form should be signed and a PDF version of it sent to calls@bluegift.eu. Additionally, the signed original should be posted to the Access Coordinator.

Deadline for applications

This 3rd Call for Applications is open until the **2nd April at 17:00 UTC**. Please note the User Selection Board can perform an early assessment of applications that are ready for deployment in Q2 & Q3 2021.
